Through the FYW project we have developed partnerships with a variety of local community groups, including the Friends of Foots Cray Meadows, Whole Systems Obesity officers in Kent, Mencap at Gravesend and others.

DFOK and Saxons are working together as a joint partner on the FYW Project. The project coordinators from each club meet regularly, at least once every two months. As the coordinators are also the leads on club development, these meetings cover a lot of areas not directly connected with FYW so the project has been a catalyst for a much closer working relationship and sharing of ideas than previously which has benefitted each club significantly.

# Mapping

The clubs have benefitted from getting a professional map funded for new areas called Mabley Green and Capstone Country Park ahead of FYW activities there.

After the FYW activity DFOK developed a combined map of Mabley Green and the already mapped Wick Woodland and held a successful Park Race series event there in July 2023 with over 100 entrants.

The Capstone Country Park map enabled Saxons to run a Medway Senior School Games Event after the FYW activity which attracted 100 year 8 school children. A similar mapping project is planned for Victoria Park in Ashford.

**Active & School Sports Partnerships**
