Website Analysis

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Rating Criteria

Excellent	All relevant information is easy/ quick to find CWO contacts details are easy to access Policies are accessible Club has added extra information/ page is engaging
Good	All relevant/ the basic information is able to be found promptly Information on how to report available. CWO contacts details are accessible Policies are accessible
Needs improvement	Some information is there but it's limited Contact details for CWO's maybe hard to find/ not there Takes a while to find important information Some links maybe out of date Policies are likely out of date but are referenced
Urgent action needed	Little or no Safeguarding information present on the website Contact details are not present Very hard for someone to find information to report/ raise a concern. Takes too long to find any information

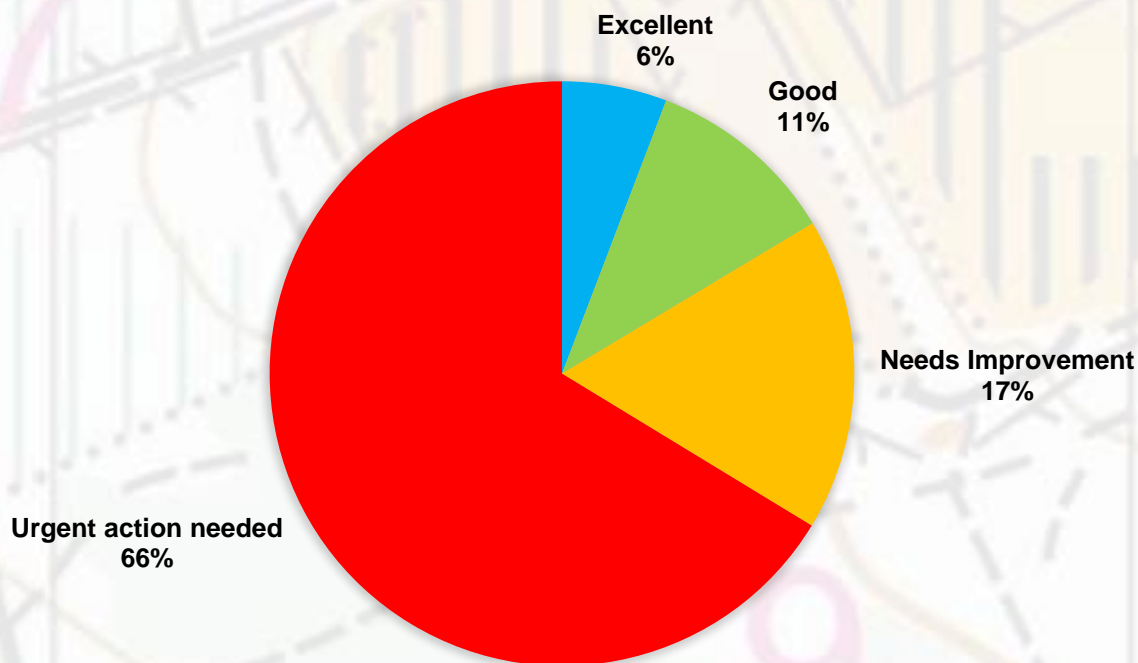
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CLUB SAFEGUARDING WEBSITE ANALYSIS
